BARC adds additional VE session March 16 due to CW requirement being dropped

Tom Parsons, W4TEP, BARC VE Liaison, announced that there will be an additional VE session held on March 16, three weeks after the new CW regulations are effective. BARC holds VE sessions on even months but since the new regulation will be effective a week after the February session, it was decided to hold one in March. Candidates will be able to upgrade a month earlier in Greenville since the next regular VE session is scheduled for April.

Technicians will be able to do a paperwork upgrade to General if they have passed Element 3 in the past year and have the CSCE. The \$14 test fee still applies.

Be sure to bring a photo ID (drivers license), original and copy of their Amateur Radio license and if applicable, original CSCE and a copy of the CSCE. The \$14 test fee applies to all applicants.

Another change that we are all going to be impacted by is the FCC decision to drop the code requirements for all licenses. The change will be effective February 23, 2007.

The immediate impact of this change should be an increase in the amount of traffic on the HF frequencies as the number of operators upgrading to General increase.

On the down side, the FCC is signaling that they believe that Morse Code is becoming obsolete. It is another sign in our culture where we are accepting the newer technologies that provide more automation and less brain power.

When I was in school, all math was done either in my head or written out on paper. No outside tools could be used.

Now students are allowed to use calculators on tests and SAT's. If you want to know the impact of this, just watch cashiers struggle to make change if their register doesn't figure it out for them.

The number of amateur radio operators has decreased as dependence on cell phones has increased. People believe that technology won't let them down, so they don't even consider how communication would take place if the communications. If communications fail, they have been trained to blame the federal government.

The next step in training us to be more dependent on technology is the removal of Morse Code. We have all heard the statement the Amateur Radio is the "only fail-safe system" of communications. We also create redundant systems in case we experience failure of our equipment or atmospheric conditions.

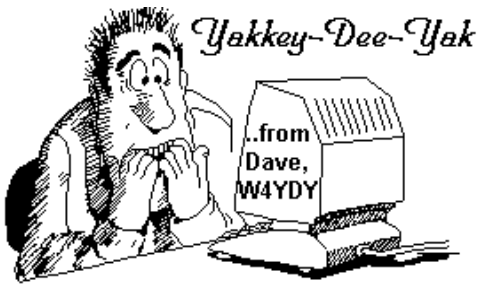

Are there any club members that have a web site that want to get it linked on the BARC web site? There are presently three linked, W4ISO, KG4WEZ and W4YDY.

The club site moved from QSL.NET due to the slow response. I have had the same trouble with the site also. But it is free. The club moved to a new domain provider last year and it has been

like another world with the fast speed and reliability. I was planning to do the same thing and I may later on if my Internet provider changes again. I recently enabled a web site that comes with Suddenlink and moved my site to <http://pages.suddenlink.net/w4ydy/>. My address at <http://www.qsl.net/w4ydy/> still works (sometimes!) but when you click on the Morse code key, it will send you to the new site. There is plenty of space allowed as you have 2 gigabytes for your email and web site. I am only using about 17 megabytes that includes a 2 megabyte video so there is a lot of room.

Quite a few club members got shifted over to Suddenlink so if any are interested and need any help getting a web site on Suddenlink enabled, I will be

glad to help. Not much help on the net but I got through it after several phone calls and emails. Still had to figure out some of the answers! The site is very fast and I have put a video on it. QSL.NET would not handle videos because of the slow speed and overload.

As some might have noticed, there are a couple of videos on the BARC web site now for those on cable or DSL. If anyone has any suggestions or short videos that members might be interested in, let me know. I can transfer VHS, 8mm, Hi8, Digital 8 tape or DVD to the computer for conversion for the web site. If it is mini-digital tape, it would have to be converted. The video should be limited to five minutes or less. Five minutes would be about a 15 to 20 megabyte file for a 320x240 video. - W4YDY

It's official! Morse code requirement ends Friday, February 23

Circle Friday, February 23, on your calendar. That's when the current 5 WPM Morse code requirement will officially disappear from the Amateur Radio Service Part 97 rules. Effective that date, applicants for a General or Amateur Extra class Amateur Radio license no longer will have to demonstrate proficiency in Morse code. They'll just have to pass the applicable written examination. Federal Register publication January 24 of the FCC's Report and Order (R&O) in the "Morse code proceeding," WT Docket 05-235, started a 30-day countdown for the new rules to become effective.

"The overall effect of this action is to further the public interest by encouraging individuals who are interested in communications technology or who are able to contribute to the advancement of the radio art, to become Amateur Radio operators; and eliminating a requirement that is now unnecessary and may discourage Amateur Service licensees from advancing their skills in the communications and technical phases of Amateur Radio," the FCC remarked in the Federal Register version of the "Morse code" R&O. The League had asked the FCC to retain the 5 WPM for Amateur Extra class applicants, but the Commission held to its decision to eliminate the requirement across the board. The rules that appeared in the Federal Register constitute their official version

The new rules also mean that starting February 23 all Technician licensees, whether or not they've passed a Morse code examination, will have CW privileges on 80, 40 and 15 meters and CW, RTTY, data and SSB privileges on 10 meters. Once the new rules go into effect Technicians may begin using their new privileges without any further action.

An applicant holding a valid Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination (CSCE) for Element 3 (General) or Element 4 (Amateur Extra) credit may redeem it for an upgrade at a Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (VEC) exam session. A CSCE is good for 365 days from the date of issuance, no exceptions.

For example, a Technician licensee holding a valid CSCE for Element 3 credit would have to apply at a VEC test session and pay the application fee, which most VECs charge, in order to receive an instant upgrade to General.

ARRL Regulatory Information Specialist Dan Henderson, N1ND, cautions that a license upgrade is *not* automatic for those holding valid CSCEs for element credit. "You must apply for the upgrade at a VEC test session, and you may not operate as /AG or /AE until you have upgraded and have been issued a

CSCE marked for upgrade," he stresses. "A valid CSCE for element credit only does not confer any operating privileges."

Henderson also advises all radio amateurs to know and fully understand their operating privileges before taking to the airwaves. Some Technician licensees reportedly started showing up on 75 meters December 15 in the mistaken belief that they had gained phone privileges there.

The FCC R&O includes an Order on Reconsideration in WT Docket 04-140 -- the so-called "omnibus" proceeding. It will modify Part 97 in response to ARRL's request to accommodate automatically controlled narrowband digital stations on 80 meters in the wake of other rule changes that became effective last December 15. The Commission designated 3585 to 3600 kHz for such operations, although that segment will remain available for CW, RTTY and data. The ARRL had requested that the upper limit of the CW/RTTY/data subband be set at 3635 kHz so there would be no change in the existing 3620 to 3635 kHz subband.

ARRL Board accepts National Emergency Response Planning Committee Report

The ARRL Board of Directors accepted the Report of the National Emergency Response Planning Committee (NERPC) when it met January 19 and 20 in Windsor, Connecticut. Upon dissolving the committee with its thanks, the Board set in motion a process to identify and implement action items in the report as soon as possible. ARRL First Vice President Kay Craigie, N3KN, chaired the 13-member NERPC, charged with developing comprehensive recommendations to improve the League's response to regional, national and international disasters. Among other things, panel members evaluated the responses and actions of ARRL and the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) during Hurricane Katrina as well as lessons learned.

"If 'lessons learned' are not followed by 'behaviors changed,' then the lessons have not been learned at all," the report concludes. The report describes disaster preparedness as "a moving target, moving faster all the time." No recommendations, plans or systems should be considered "the permanent answers for all cir-

cumstances and hazards," the report asserts.

The unprecedented scope of the Katrina response placed ARRL Headquarters into a leadership coordination role through national-level requests for help from served agencies such as the American Red Cross. While the level of expertise in emergency communications and emergency management among US radio amateurs is growing, the report noted, so is the expectation that the ARRL provide first-rate leadership and guidance.

Among the report's wide-ranging recommendations and suggestions:

- * enhance ARRL and ARES training in basic message handling.

- * develop a continuing education course covering installation, configuration, and use of Winlink 2000 for e-mail.

- * formally establish a national ARES volunteer database for use during major disasters and establish training criteria.

- * institute a Major Disaster Emergency Coordinator (MDEC) function to coordinate responses to large-scale national or regional disasters or emergencies.

- * become better acquainted with the emergency response needs of distant ARRL sections, such as Pacific, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands and Alaska.

- * improve working relationships with national-level served agencies.

- * ensure ARRL staff training in the Incident Command System (ICS) and National Incident Management System (NIMS) and, as necessary, adapt ARRL's emergency response structure to the Unified Command model.

In addition, ARRL President Joel Harrison, W5ZN, has appointed an ad hoc committee to study issues relating to background investigations as they apply to ARRL Amateur Radio volunteers and to recommend a background investigation policy. - *via ARRL Letter Online 1/26/07*

Bill seeks BPL interference study, report to Congress

US Rep Mike Ross, WD5DVR (D-AR), has introduced a bill in the 110th Congress calling on the FCC to study the interference potential of broadband over power line (BPL) technology and report its findings back to Congress. One of two radio amateurs in the House, Ross submitted the "Emergency Amateur Radio Interference Protection Act of 2007" (HR 462) on January 12. The bill's official text became available this week. ARRL President Joel Harrison, W5ZN, says the League shares Ross's concern about interference to emergency communication networks.

"We wholly support his effort to ensure that public safety remains a priority over flawed political agendas regarding communication technology," Harrison commented.

The bill calls for the FCC to conduct "a comprehensive BPL service study leading to improved rules to prevent interference." If the measure is adopted by both houses of Congress and signed by the president, the FCC would have to undertake a study of BPL's interference potential within 90 days of enactment and report to

the House Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.

In 2005, Ross introduced a non-binding House resolution, HRes 230, in the 109th Congress that would have had the FCC conduct "a full and complete analysis" of radio interference from BPL with an eye toward revising the FCC rules that govern BPL to minimize the potential of harmful interference. It was unsuccessful.

Last year, the US House passed a telecommunications bill containing language that Ross proposed requiring the FCC to study the interference potential of BPL systems. The study requirement did not make its way into the final version of the bill, however.

HR 462 would require the Commission to address several technical facets, including variations in BPL emission field strength with distance from power lines and a technical justification for using a particular distance extrapolation factor when making measurements.

The FCC also would have to investigate the degree of notching necessary

"to protect the reliability of mobile radio communications," and provide a technical justification for permitted BPL radiated emission levels relative to ambient noise levels. Finally, the study would have to outline options for new or improved BPL rules aimed at preventing harmful interference to public safety and other radio communication systems.

Ross's bill zeroes in on some of the same issues the ARRL cited last October when it asked the US Court of Appeals -- DC Circuit to review certain aspects of the Part 15 BPL rules. The ARRL specifically has taken issue with §15.611 (c)(1)(iii), which sets a lower standard of protection for licensed mobile stations in any radio service, including public safety, that may receive BPL interference.

The League's lawsuit also faults the FCC's decision not to adjust the 40 dB per decade "extrapolation factor" applied to BPL emission measurements taken at distances from power lines other than those specified in Part 15.
